#### **Communication/IT Committee Report-**

The Communication/Media Committee is vigorously involved in planning for the 2025 season. Here's a summary of what's keeping us busy!

- 1. TeamSnap has been identified as a viable replacement for InstaTeam. It is a team management application with more robust features and administration assistance. Beta testing is taking place to determine if TeamSnap should replace InstaTeam. If so, Rob is targeting January to introduce to the membership.
- 2. Website development pace is picking up. A landing page and related links have been crafted. Members are learning about creating content so that the role is not solely on Rob's shoulders! The pages will be updated after a couple of training sessions and tasks are assigned.
  - This same group is learning and bringing expertise to the conversation about organizing pictures and videos.
- 3. As the website content is completed, the images and updated language will be used to update the Tellico Life page.
- 4. The banner is being updated to reflect the new logo and language highlighting the THDBC "brand"/culture.
- 5. The pamphlet handout will also be updated.
- 6. We stand ready to support other sub-committees. Printed materials will be reduced as we look to the website as the go-to place for information for club and potential members.
- 7. Lynne's expertise with Google resources has expanded our ability for communicating and compiling information. The Google platform also dovetails into the website for organization of videos and other information.
- 8. Jane is also working with Rob and Lynne to determine efficient and effective ways to present and organize event photos, video and other information. She will also be called upon to produce fun, specific-use videos.

What a terrific crew! They have brought expertise, are willing to learn more and care about how the THDBC information is preserved and presented.

**Learn About Serenity** 

Tatum faced a tumultuous past, marked by physical abuse, substance abuse, and unhealthy relationships. Despite her efforts to escape, she found herself couch surfing and struggling to break free. In her darkest moment, she turned to God, seeking a way out. She asked God to open a door and make it clear to her that it's what He wanted her to do. Her prayer was answered when she went to rehab and eventually, <a href="KARM's Serenity program">KARM's Serenity program</a>. During her time there, she served in the kitchen and found spiritual, emotional, and financial guidance.

Tatum now has restored relationships with her family, rediscovered her self-worth, and found her identity in Christ! She's working towards a brighter future, setting goals like pursuing a CNA degree and rebuilding her life. She credits <a href="Knox Area Rescue Ministries">Knox Area Rescue Ministries</a> for providing a safe haven, teaching her financial responsibility, and helping her find purpose and direction.

As you recall, Jane Coggins was recognized as a top fundraiser for KARM at the June Festival. She passed on the following anecdote in conjunctions with the "Coats for Cold Collection event.

"Tatum was one of my former students. She was on my caseload for all four years in high school. I also had two of her siblings, one older and one younger. Sadly, her older brother passed away last summer from a drug overdose. My purpose for sharing is to say how glad I was to have spoken to Tatum at last year's memorial service gathering for her brother. At the time, she was just starting to attend KARM's Serenity program. She has been featured in many advertisements for KARM over the last several months. Participating in KARM and supporting them in the Dragon Boat race helped young women like Tatum. I not only know her story, but also her personally. It was heartwarming to hear how well she is doing and that she has a renewed purpose. She will make a wonderful CNA. "


